

GOLF CLUB AT LITCHFIELD RESERVE

Pawley's Island, South Carolina



The Reserve is a 17,000 sq. ft. private clubhouse for Greg Norman's first golf course in the Carolinas. The clubhouse's design allowed for expansion from the initial 4,000 sq. ft. Golf House facility into an exclusive members-only clubhouse with grand foyer, library, formal dining, locker areas and card rooms.

Given the Club's coastal South Carolina setting, Jerry Spangler brought a casual low-country style to the design. The Club's informal look is further enhanced by the use of multiple building volumes, creating a rambling "country inn" appearance.

Materials include wood-mold red brick, white clapboard siding, standing seam metal roof, and tall traditional windows.
